## Here's how to get started

- ▶ **Apply early.** Request a training at least 135 days (4½ months) prior to the event date.
- ▶ **Let people know.** Conduct outreach to local and regional partners to participate in the training. Enroll up to 40 participants, but there must be a minimum of 30 participants at the training.
- ▶ **Find a place to hold the training.** Secure a training facility and cover facility costs (including audio-visual equipment).
- ▶ **Relax.** OVC TTAC will arrange for the training event to meet your needs on your schedule.
