What are best practices for response teams?





Key Elements

- Shared understanding, values, and vision
- Appropriate crosssection of members
- Involvement of staff at all levels of the organization
- Clear roles and responsibilities
- Open and frequent communication

- Clear decision-making authority and process
- Ability to manage conflict and compromise
- Mutual respect, understanding, and trust
- Sufficient resources
- Skilled leadership

Common Challenges

- Lack of awareness and support
- Insufficient time
- Exclusion of people with lived experience
- Failure to make meetings and events safe and accessible
- Limited or no financial resources
- Turf wars
- Silos
