



How do I enable Flash Player in Google Chrome?


To enable Flash in Google Chrome, go to *Tools*, then *Settings*.




Select *Advanced* on the left side bar, then click *Privacy and security*.



Select Site Settings.




Check that Flash is enabled (it should indicate *Ask first*). If it is not enabled (it indicates *Block sites from running Flash*), click the arrow on the right and toggle from *Block sites from running Flash* to *Ask first*. 


How do I enable Flash Player in Internet Explorer?


To enable Flash in Internet Explorer, go to *Tools*, then *Manage add-ons*.



Select *Show: All add-ons*.




Make sure that Flash is enabled. If the status is *Disabled*, select *Shockwave Flash Object*, then select *Enable* toward the bottom of the pop-up screen. To download Flash Player go to: <https://get.adobe.com/flashplayer/otherversions/>.



How do I enable Flash Player in Mozilla Firefox?

To enable Flash in Mozilla Firefox, go to *Open menu*, then *Add-ons*.



Select *Plugins*, and make sure that Flash is *Enabled*. If Flash is listed in the Disabled section, select the ellipses and then select *Ask to Activate*. To download Flash Player go to:
